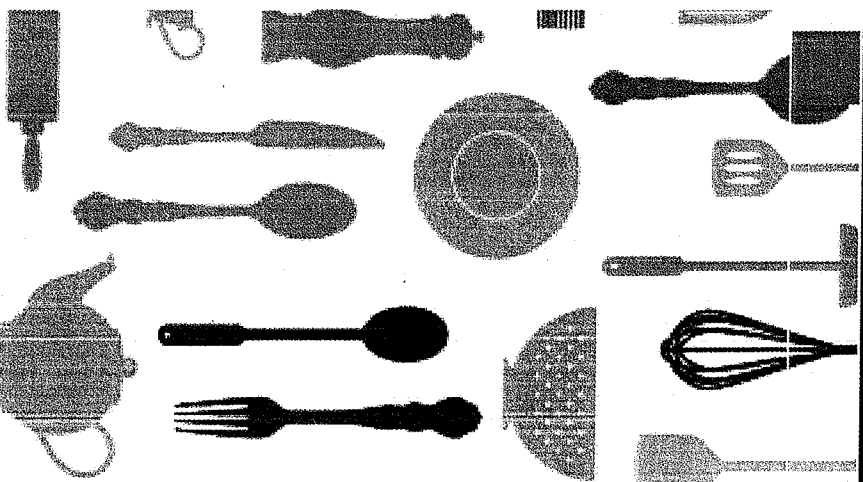

Tips and Tricks

Plastic shoe boxes work well for the kits because they stack well.

Utensils can either be purchased with donated money or your group can have a utensil drive.

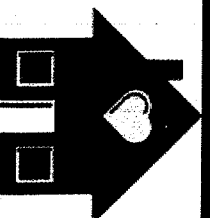
The advantage to buying the utensils yourself is that you know they will fit in the box.

Assembly lines work well for the packing event.

If younger kids are packing, be sure to check the completed boxes after the event.

8 EASY STEPS!!

Step 1: Get the utensils – fundraising the money? Host a utensil drive?

Step 2: Determine where you will hold the packing event – school? Church? Other organization? **ADVERTISE!**

Step 3: Collect the materials – make sure you have enough for all kits.

Step 4: Prep the utensils – all packaging needs to be removed so the utensils fit in the box.

Step 5: Set up the event – create stations where the people can put together the kits.

Step 6: Start packing the kits! It does not take long to put one together, so do not plan a whole evening of packing!

Step 7: Collect all completed kitchen kits – make sure they don't have any duplicate or missing items.

Step 8: Deliver all of your kits to PROP Shop!
